Out of School Care Program -**Great Value**

Rimbey's Out of School Care Program is a valuable service for our community. Many families are already benefiting from this program and there is still room for more kids. If you have an elementary aged child that needs a place to go for an hour or two after school, we would invite you to consider our program. The rates for this service are very reasonable as they are equal to or less than similar programs around Central Alberta. If you register for a whole month the cost works out to be only \$3.80 per hour per child. If you pay for part time care, the cost works out to be \$5.20 per hour per child (rates based on Feb. 2012). There is also money available for families that cannot afford the costs of child care through Alberta's subsidy program. The subsidy program is easy to sign-up for and use. It offers ot, full-course meal that is delivered y courteous, friendly volunteers to he client's home at noon at a inimal set cost. The main purpose of the Meals on Wheels program is to nprove the nutritional status for the ndividuals receiving the service. It i from the hospital, provide social contact for people living at home, and llow the disabled and elderly to naintain their independence as long as possible. Food Bank:

The Food Bank is a centralized warehouse that stores and gives and families experiencing a crisis ituation. The process is for an ndividual or family to receive food i imple, however follows strict uidelines. The individual can apply n person or phone the Rimbey ommunity Home Help Services in he Provincial Building for ssessment. Food hampers are provided when a need has been stablished. The Food Bank is an emergency Food service. Anybody can find themselves in financial crisis. The majority of the clients the Food Bank serves are the working oor. When making minimum wage nost clients have to have at least two obs and still cannot make ends neet. All clients of the Rimbey Food Bank must have registered with FCSS and be a resident of Rimbey or the West half of the County of Ponoka. The Food Bank operates on non-profit basis, receives donations of food and cash. The cash is then other items the Food Bank might be ow on. The Food Bank receives Church groups, Merchants, Market Gardens, Service Groups, The General Public, Food Banks Alberta Alberta Food Banks. Purpose:

On December 15, 2011 in the early morning hours Derek Jenson stalked his ex girlfriend Tabitha and her three friends on highway 2 near Claresholm Alberta. Derek rammed into the back of Shayna's vehicle making her stop to investigate the issue. Derek got out of his car and shot Shayna numerous times- she is a miracle and has survived. The other victims Tabitha (Derek's ex girlfriend), Tanner and Mitch were killed before Derek turned the gun on himself... Tabitha and her friends are victims of Domestic Homicide. Domestic homicide, or murder by an intimate partner, represent 17% of all solved homicides in Canada and 47% of all family homicides (2009). I would like to take the opportunity to focus on this topic in the next few newsletters and breakdown some facts regarding why women become so high risk when leaving their abusive relationship. First let me introduce to you the 12 main "red flags" which will indicate to you that your partner may become an abuser- or is your partner already??

- Heavy drinking or drug abuse (especially if he uses substances as an excuse for what he does: "The alcohol made me do it.")
- Abuse during the courtship period is a guarantee of further abuse that will become more frequent and severe. Don't marry him with the belief that "I can change him." You won't.
- 3. Morbid jealousy. This may be a bit flattering at first, but will be a curse later on. You will never convince him that you are innocent of his accusations.
- Past child abuse and/or witness of marital violence.
 This happens in some cases. Children learn what
 they live. Boys tend to copy their fathers. Abused children discipline their own children as they were taught.
 He may be a "violence carrier".
- 5. **Inability to handle frustration**. If he blows up and explodes at small things, and reacts with a tantrum over minor things, he may act out frustration with violence in a marriage. How he deals with anger is the key.
- 6. A violent temper. This speaks for itself. If you feel fear when he acts out his anger, that fear is a warning signal. Listen to it!
- 7. Cruelty to animals, abuse and mistreatment of pets...What makes you know he will treat you any differently?
- 8. **Preoccupation with weapons**. They are an extension of self. A person is what she/he lives. If he ever "playfully" points a gun at you or ever gestures at you with another weapon, what could happen if he became very angry with you?
- 9. Mental illness. A person with an unsound mind or without any sense of moral responsibility or guilt may not be in control of his actions. Does he act in ways that you feel are abnormal or strange?
- 10. A poor self-image; insecurity about his own masculinity. If he feels compulsive about always being "one up" and dominating and he lives out a macho role at all times, you will be subject to his control and possibly treated like one of his possessions. He may feel he has the right to treat you like his property, to do as he pleases.
- 11. A pattern of blaming others, particularly his wife, for his problems. If he never accepts his faults and responsibilities when things go wrong, be ready to be blamed for everything.
- 12. Acceptance of violence as an appropriate problem-solving method. Do you want a man who talks out or acts out his anger?
