3. IH Truck Celebration
 - Copies of the poster will be ready for pick up at the town office.
 - Some confusion with what type of casino and getting the licensing for the casino. Recreation will get a letter from RCMP in support of a fun casino and will help with straightening up the confusion. Casino will go ahead at the Arena Lobby. Judy will follow through with arrangements.
 - Penny Carnival will be situated on the north side of the arena and if bad weather will move into the arena. Stairway will be the blocker from the casino so that washrooms are available to the public.
 - Melissa to make a signage to put down near the highway to direct people into the penny carnival. There will be popcorn, cotton candy, Sunny 94 will be onsite, AADAC game, Parent Link will be on site doing crafts, face painting. Charge will be 5 coupons for a loonie and 1 coupon per game. A remote control car demo will take place with the possibility of a draw for a remote control car.
 - If the park needs help with equipment and access call the town.
 - Cotton Candy will be available at the park
 - 3 additional vendors will be on site.
 - Sold 30 supper tickets and 30 dance tickets.
 - A bulletin board for advertisement is being made.
 - Require volunteers to cook for the Breakfast and Dinner.
 - First aide information sites will be located at the shoot out and the park. Tents are required.
 - Die cast model trucks will be for sale at the park and town office.
 - Special guests that are confirmed for the IH Show is Fred Crismon; Ken Fox, Glover International; George Kirkland, Southland International; and Dale will do thanks on behalf of the Town.
 - Quilt displays will be on one side of the truck museum and will be quilting demonstrations. Set up will begin Friday Night – Saturday Morning.
 - Require four young guys to push vehicles around and help set up stands. Friday will bring the quilt displays over.
 - 8-10 trucks will be in the parade.

- Town office will do call out for a work bee on the trucks and to just give out Grant's Cell.
- Kinsmen will talk to thunder road and see if there is any extra fencing that can be used up at the park.
- Carnival equipment to be moved by Public Works on Thursday.
- Public works will put out barricades on the parade route. Rodeo Association does not want to help with parade, Cheryl has list of who wants to be in the parade. Parade will leave from the school grounds.
- Volunteers will be needed to block the routes. Keep parade simple, Cheryl to work with Moira for traffic control.
- Farmers market will move to the old picnic area.
- Show and Shine will require a parking volunteer and people for registration
- Sales booth will be set up at the park
- Shoot out only requires north side of Ag building for Shoot out contestants.
- Volunteer appreciation will be a bonfire pit which will be set up by the Historical Society featuring hot dogs.
- Handi van runs for the farmer's market on call from 9-11 and is available. Don MacFayden to organize drivers for the weekend.
- Breakfast amount will be based on previous event numbers.
- Drive in movie; the Ag Society not sure if will have a food donation or 50/50 draw. Grant will make sure screen set up on Friday.
- Advertising to be done with Sunny 94.1, Central Alberta Life, KG and Z99, and News Release to all local newspapers.
