



When I was asked to run for Council, I accepted because Rimbey is a great town and I want it to continue to be a great place to raise our family. I accepted because young people need to get involved so we can learn and continue to govern in the future. I accepted because I was hoping to bring a younger generation's perspective to Council. I accepted because, rather than the negative "complain and blame our leaders" I felt it would be better to join the leadership team and help bring about the positive changes that the residents of Rimbey want and deserve.

I have the greatest respect for my Council Colleagues. We may not always agree, but that creates important and healthy discussions. We have come together as an effective team with our common goal focus being "what is best for the residents of Rimbey." I feel that in this short time, we have achieved a lot of what we were elected to do:

Construction will soon begin on the new Seniors Lodge.

5. Delegation 5.1 MLA Mary Anne Jablonski Delegation Discussion (7.1)
- Mayor Pankiw welcomed MLA Jablonski to the Council Meeting.
- MLA Jablonski spoke on the following items:
- The astronomical population growth that has hit Alberta.
  - Benefits of a Strong economy and caring communities
  - Currently 4 million people call Alberta home.
  - Over the last year Alberta has grown by 136,000 people
  - Key factor in attracting new Albertans has been the province's strong economy, which Alberta has the strongest economy in Canada.

- Job growth in Alberta is 83.3%
- Population doubled since 1978
- Alberta is the 3rd popular choice for immigrants behind Quebec and Toronto.
- Fastest growing communities in Canada include Red Deer, Sylvan Lake, Blackfalds, Penhold, Olds and Lacombe.
- Plan to accommodate this growth is in place and called “The Building Alberta Plan”.
- New Cancer Centre opened in Red Deer; therefore people will not have to travel to Edmonton or Calgary for cancer treatment.
- New 100 bed continuing care centre in Red Deer.
- Two things that people want more than anything else is to stay close to family and friends in their own communities and not to be separated by their spouses/partner. Trying to help each other in neighboring communities to accomplish what is important.
- If we have good homecare people will be able to stay in their homes longer.
- 211 is a program to help you find what social programs are out there [ab.211.ca](http://ab.211.ca)

Mayor Pankiw thanked MLA Mary Anne Jablonski on behalf of Town Council for being here tonight.

### 5.2 Neighbourhood Place – Leanne Evans (7.2)

Mayor Pankiw welcomed Leanne. Evans to the Council Meeting.

Ms. Evans spoke on

- The Community Wellness Group is working on a partnership with the Catholic Social Services to provide a counseling service in our area.
- As a pilot project Catholic Social Services has a councilor available to come to Rimbey one afternoon a week.
- This program is supported by many groups and organizations in Rimbey as it would be a benefit to many.
- Alberta Mental Health Services indicated they could potentially refer 2 – 3 people a month to the program.
- The RCMP are called out to 2 – 3 domestic violence cases a week, family counseling would be a preventative measure to these statistics.
- Rimbey victim’s Services unit it supportive to this initiative and have backed it with part of the initial funding.
- The Social Worker at the Rimbey Junior Senior High and the Outreach School is very supportive of Red Deer Catholic Social Services and their referral program in Rimbey and will make references to the program.
- FCSS supports the initiative and reports that there have been attempts to bring in family counseling by different groups over the years and it never really materialized, they believe that Catholic Social Services is a reputable agency that this is an ideal route to take, and they have also committed to funding this project.

Mayor Pankiw thanked Leanne Evans for her presentation on the Community Wellness Group and The Catholic social Services partnership pilot program.

**BACKGROUND:**

Councillor Olsen submitted his written resignation from Council to the CAO on July 9, 2014. With this resignation, the Town is required to hold a by-election. Several decisions must be made in this respect.

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**DISCUSSION:**

Relevant Sections of the Municipal Government Act (MGA) and the Local Authorities Election Act (LAEA) are as follows:

**MGA:**

Section 161(3) The resignation is effective on the date it is received by the chief administrative officer even if a later date is set out in the resignation.

Section 161(4) The chief administrative officer must report the resignation at the first council meeting after receiving the resignation.

Section 165 Unless a council sets an earlier date, election day for a by-election under section 162 or 163 is 90 days after the vacancy occurs.

**LAEA:**

Section 11(1)(b) Election day for a local jurisdiction in the case of a by-election... shall be the day fixed by a resolution of the elected authority.

Section 13(1) An elected authority may, by resolution, appoint a returning officer for the purposes of conducting elections under this Act.

Section 25 Nomination day shall be 4 weeks before election day.

Section 73(1) An elected authority may by resolution provide for holding an advance vote on any vote to be held in an election.

Section 73(3) If a resolution is enacted under subsection (1), the returning officer must determine the days and hours when the advance vote is to be held.

Administration is recommending holding the election on October 6, 2014 to avoid having a nomination date in August. If the election is held on October 6, 2014, then nomination day will be Monday, September 8, 2014.

Administration is recommending an upset limit of \$3,000 be allocated for the by-election. The main costs are for advertising and for paying Deputy Returning Officers on the day of the election. This is an "upset" limit; the expectation is that the actual costs will be closer to \$2,000.

Regarding response options, Council could choose a different date than the date recommended. If no date is set by Council then the election would be held on Tuesday, October 7, 2014. Council could appoint a different person as returning officer. Council could identify a different upset limit for costs; Council could identify a different funding source for the funding (such as a different reserve).

Council may choose to hold an advance vote. Should Council choose to do so, the approximate cost of an advance vote would be \$500 which would cover advertising and the cost of one Deputy Returning Officer (the Chief Administrative Officer would attend the Advance Vote as the Presiding Deputy Returning Officer and there would be no additional costs to the Town). The additional costs for the advance vote can still be accommodated within the \$3000 upset limit.

To hold a by-election to fill the vacant Councillor position on the Town of Rimbeby Council, on Monday, October 6, 2014.

To appoint Mr. Lucien Cloutier as the returning officer for the Town of Rimbeby by-election to be held on October 6, 2014.



# Town of Rimbey

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## **RB00 – Rimbey General**

This project is for small general requests for the Town.

(May 6) Concept Plan for skateboard / BMX facility will be discussed with Council at strategic planning session.

(May 20) No Change.

(June 3) Met with Town staff to discuss proposed development with Cavalier Ventures Corporation Legacy Court Phase 2. Developer to provide Town with detailed design drawings for proposed layout for legal, lot grading, roadways, underground and shallow utilities.

(June 17)

- Cavalier Ventures Corporation has provided the Town with a set of "As-Built" drawings, drawings are being reviewed and comments will be forwarded to Town by June 20.
- Tagish met with representatives from the Lions Club to complete an inspection of the existing walking trail systems. Letter of recommendations will be sent to Lions Club and Town by June 20, 2014.
- Town and New Line Skateparks Inc. have scheduled a Public meeting at the Community Center June 30, 2014 to discuss the different options for a skateboard park and the proposed location.

## **RB87 – Hwy 20 Intersections – (GM)**

This project consists of granular base construction (ready for asphalt paving to be completed by others) for both the 54 Av and 58 Av intersections on Hwy 20. Alberta transportation as agreed to pave the intersections in conjunction with the asphalt overlaying of Hwy 53

(May 6) Received approval from Alberta Transportation. Preparing contract agreement for endorsement prior to start of construction.

(May 6 – May 20) Received approval from Alberta Transportation. Preparing contract agreement for endorsement prior to start of construction.

(June 3) Contracts were signed by Town and Contractor. Both intersections were surveyed and Contractor received construction grade sheet. Contractor completed First Call requirements, and is scheduled to start construction in the week of June 3, subject to weather.

(June 17) Nikirk Bros Contracting Ltd. are on site and are working on the west side of Hwy 20 and 54 Ave. The Contractor has completed the following work:

- saw cut and removed the asphalt adjacent to the west shoulder
- extended the culverts to accommodate the new construction
- stripped and relocated the top soil and sod along the west Hwy shoulder
- cut a bench along shoulder, placed and compacted the material in ditch bottom.

**RB100 – 51st Avenue from 44-46<sup>th</sup> Street (2012 Construction) – (LS)**

(May 6) No change.

(May 20) Will touch base with CCA this week and see if we can set up a meeting to discuss the fixes.

(June 3) Awaiting CCA to send letter with their proposed course of action for 51<sup>st</sup> Ave. settlements.

(June 17) Received letter from CCA regarding course of action. Talked to CCA and they are potentially mobilizing into Rimbey by the end of the week to add some leveling course to the worst settled areas.

**RB102 South Lagoon Baffle Curtain – GM**

This project consists of improving the baffle curtain support system.

(May 6 – June 3) No Change.

(June 17) Spoke to D & M Concrete about improvements completed at south Lagoon. Modifications to the baffle curtain support system was completed by the Contractor during the winter when the curtain was frozen into the ice. Contractor will be on site to make the final adjustments.

**RB106 Rimbey Northeast Lagoon Subdrain Upgrades - GM**

This project is related to all work involving the NE Lagoon repairs and drainage.

(May 6) Contacted AMEC to provide a budget to complete a study of the hydraulic connection between the NE Lagoon and Well 13.

(May 20) Tagish is compiling information related to the NE Lagoon Upgrades and ground water monitoring wells, which will be forwarded to AMEC to complete the hydraulic connection study.

(June 3) AMEC is reviewing all information regarding information on both the NE Lagoon, lagoon under drain and Well # 13. AMEC will provide a cost estimate to provide a study to determine if Well # 13 is affected by the NE Lagoon.

(June 3 – June 17) AMEC is reviewing all information regarding information on both the NE Lagoon, lagoon under drain and Well # 13. AMEC will provide a cost estimate to provide a study to determine if Well # 13 is affected by the NE Lagoon.

**RB108 2013 Walking Trails– GM**

Project: Construct an asphalt trail system from the Rimbey Community Center to Hwy 53 - 55 St, then south along the west boundary of NE 20 – 42 – 2 W, connecting to the Lions Walking Trail.

(May 6 – May 20) No Change.

(June 3) Border Paving will be meeting with sub-contractor (Appollo Landscaping) to set work schedule to complete landscaping and damage to trail from spring run-off.

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

**BACKGROUND:**

In 2000, a promotional publication was made through the Rimbey Chamber of Commerce and it was published by TNC Publishing Inc. (see copy attached).  
 In February, 2013, a publishing agreement was signed between TNC Publications and the Town (signed by the CAO of the day) for TNC to produce a “marketing magazine”, to come out in the month of June, 2013. The magazine was not published by the contractual date. In this agreement (attached) the Town has a number of obligations which includes providing content, providing a list of advertisers, and proofing and editing the document, to mention a few of the obligations.  
 In April 1, 2013 the Town issued a letter (signed by the CAO of the day) which went to Rimbey Business Owners (attached). The letter served to endorse the project and encouraged businesses to purchase advertising in the publication.  
 In November, 2013 (several months after the contractual production date) the Town of Rimbey paid \$1395.00 for an ad to appear in the TNC Publication.  
 In reviewing the minutes of the Council meetings from February, 2013 forward, we have not been able to find any reference to this project.  
 On July 2, 2014, Mr. Jack came to see me about this project, ultimately requesting more funding for it. I requested that he submit his request to us in writing. Attached is the email submitted in this respect. It is worth noting that the amount of the revenue collected to date is more than twice the minimum required as identified in the original contract.  
 On July 10, 2014 I spoke with the former CAO regarding this project. He acknowledged the project, the letter he signed and the advertisement which was purchased by the Town for the publication. The former CAO also indicated that content was provided to TNC by the Town.  
 On July 17, 2014, Mr. Jack submitted another email on this issue (attached). This email contained the formal funding request which is being presented to Council today for consideration.

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**DISCUSSION:**

I have recommended that we not approve any additional funding for this project. The contract has not been fulfilled, nor is there any indication of support for this project from the previous Council. The advertising minimum identified in the contract has been more than doubled so there does not appear to be a reason for the Town to become further involved in this project and the project should be able to proceed. There is no indication in the records as to who initiated this project and that is a question which has remained unanswered to this point.


The actual benefit which would potentially be realized by the Town as a result of this project is unclear. The Town already invested \$1395 in advertising towards this project and previously provided content.

With respect to response options, Council could choose to approve the request, approve a different contribution amount, invite Mr. Jack to attend a Council meeting to discuss the project in further detail or Council could table this matter for further information. The advantages of approving an addition contribution are that the publication would potentially be an additional four pages longer and would allow for more content. As well, TNC had indicated that it would be more feasible to issue more copies of the guide with the additional funding. The disadvantages of approving more funding are that a funding source (such as reserves) would have to be accessed in order to cover this amount and that, even with the additional funding, based on the fact that the publication was to be produced in 2013 and wasn't despite the fact that adequate advertising was obtained, there is the concern with whether or not, or when, this publication would actually proceed to printing. Should Council choose to consider this funding request, it is suggested that a revised agreement be sought with firm publications deadlines instituted within it.

**RECOMMENDED ACTION:**

That Council refuses the request submitted by TNC Publishing Group for a contribution of \$1400 towards the cost of producing a marketing magazine for the area.

To submit a written request to TNC Publishing Group to issue a refund of the \$1395 paid to TNC Publishing Group by the Town of Rimbey for an advertisement which was to appear in the marketing magazine for Rimbey that was to be published by TNC Publishing Group.

**1900:** The town of Rimbey was named after the original settlers, the Rimbey Brothers.

**1902:** The Kansas Ridge School was built. Rimbey now has a Nursery School, a Kindergarten, an Elementary School, a Junior / Senior High School and the Rimbey Christian School.

**1903:** Rimbey's first postmaster was Mr. Cox. The mail was hauled from Lacombe by Joe Marshall who was paid \$5.00 per round trip!

**1907:** Mrs. Wates had her house moved into town and operated it as the first hotel called "Jamaica House." Rimbey now has a Hotel, 2 Motels and 2 Bed and Breakfasts.

**1907:** The first Creamery was built with shares being sold to the settlers.

**1908:** The first church was completed being the "Anglican Church of Epiphany." Rimbey now has over twelve religious institutions.

**1907-1915:** Considerable building was being done including a livery barn, hall, store, barbershop and pool hall. The first resident doctor arrived in 1914. Rimbey now has 5 resident doctors who work out of a modern medical clinic.

**1919:** This year saw the completion of the railway from Lacombe with three round trips a week.

**1926:** The Beatty House was completed and was declared a Historic Site in the mid-1980's.

**1930:** St. Paul's Hospital was opened with 16 beds.

**1949:** St. Paul's Hospital was replaced by a Municipal Hospital. Rimbey now has a fully modernized Hospital complete with Acute Care and Auxiliary Care Facilities. We also have two senior citizen lodges and apartments.

**1961:** Gulf Canada Resources Ltd. started construction of the Rimbey Gas Plant. It was the biggest gas processing facility in Canada at that time. Gulf has since expanded the facility and is a major employer in the area.

**1982:** Construction of the Rimbey Community Center commenced and included a Curling Rink, Art Room, Nursery School and meeting rooms.

**1995:** The Rimbey New Arena Society started construction of the Ice Arena.

**1999:** Development began for adult living communities for our 50+ citizens







# HISTORIC ATTRACTIONS

**T**HE "FRIENDLY INTERNATIONAL TOWN" DERIVES ITS NICKNAME from the Smithsonian International Truck Museum. Located at Pas-Ka-Poo Park, the museum contains nineteen 1/2 ton International (IH) trucks all in mint condition. They range from a 1935 model to a 1974 model which is the last year they were made. This collection reflects the history of the IH Truck, a mainstay of the family farm, with one truck for every two years of manufacture.

Many vintage truck lovers have come to Rimbey to view this unique collection - *the only one of its kind in North America!*

Pas-Ka-Poo Park boasts other museums that house an excellent collection of stuffed eagles, hawks and owls plus the telephone equipment of the last rural phone company in Alberta!

Few museum complexes in Alberta can offer such a comprehensive perspective on our province's early history. South of the Park, located at

the 4-way stop, is the Beatty House, a registered historic site which has been preserved as an excellent example of 1920's architecture. This site also offers picnic tables for you and your family to sit awhile and relax!

**BACKGROUND:**

As tenants of the Peter Lougheed Community Centre, the Rimbey Nursery School has written the attached letter to Council requesting funds for some renovations to the Nursery School.

The Nursery School Board has indicated that they would like to replace the flooring, repaint the walls and replace the cupboards below the south facing wall. The cost of these renovations has been quoted at over \$8,000.00. The Board has indicated that they would like to have the Town purchase the supplies and they would provide the labour and would like to complete the renovation prior to September 15, 2014.

The second option put forth by the Nursery School Board is to extend their lease to justify the time spent on applying for grants to cover the cost of the supplies. The current lease is for 2 years and it expires December 31, 2015.

**DISCUSSION:**

Investigation of the Nursery School Room suggests that the renovations requested would be beneficial to the aesthetics of the room and enhance the safety of the children from scrapes and trip hazards.

Currently, the 2014 Community Centre repair/maintenance budget has \$0 for repairs towards the Nursery School room.


Administration is recommending that this request be deferred to the 2015 budget process at which time Council may or may not approve some, any or all funding for the project for 2015. In the meantime, we are suggesting that the current lease be extended for an additional two years. The reason for this recommendation is that, if ultimately the Board secures its own funding sources, the extension of their lease will ensure that they will gain a longer-term benefit from the renovations.

Council has several options besides the recommendation. Council could provide some, any or all funding this year. A funding source, such as unrestricted surplus, would have to be identified to pay these costs. Council could approve extending the lease and not consider funding the project. Council could agree to defer it to the Budget process but not extend the term of the lease. Council could refuse the request entirely.

**RECOMMENDED ACTION:**

That Council defers the request submitted by the Rimbey Nursery School for renovations to their lease space within the Peter Lougheed Community Centre to the 2015 Budget process and to extend the Rimbey Nursery School lease until December 31, 2017, with a 3% increase in lease fee per year to account for inflation.

As tenants of your Peter Lougheed Community Centre, we are writing to request funds for some minor renovations to the Nursery School room.

The first and preferred option would be for the town to pay for some specific upgrades. The existing floor has holes and stains, and seems to be lifting in some areas; we would like to replace it with EZ fit flooring from Rimbey Builders Supply. Secondly, we would like to apply a fresh coat of paint to reflect a clean, fresh look to the room. To support both local building companies, we have paint quotes from both Castle Builders, as well as Rimbey Co-op. Lastly, the cupboards below the south facing window need to be replaced because of "wear and tear". See attached quotes for pricing. Photos are also included.

If funds are not available, the second option would be for us to request an extended lease on the space so we can justify the time spent on applying for grants, securing funding and using that money on the building. Five years ago, the Rimbey Nursery School Society put the money forth to build a new bathroom and we have painted many times.

The Peter Laugheed Community Centre has been and continues to be an ideal space for us; it's located near several green spaces, and the access to the gym and community centre has been a true asset. We appreciate our space very much, and would love to continue to grow there.

The Board has fundraised \$3000.00 to put towards other upgrades and furniture for the school. Recently, the Board members have been under a lot of pressure because of financial restrictions and staffing issues. Our human resources are limited for writing grants and applying for more money.

Ideally, we would love to have the much-needed renovations done before the start of school (September 15, 2014), or even for the centre's grand opening on August 22! Our Board members have committed themselves (and their spouses!) to putting in the labour required to complete the project. We look forward to hearing from you, and appreciate your time.

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



- (c) Defer the collection of a tax;

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## **PUBLIC WORKS REPORT MAY & JUNE, 2014**

Over the last couple of months Public Works has been active with the following projects:

**PARKS:** Garbage receptacles and park benches were installed at the Town Office, Pool & walking trails. Routine maintenance of lawns is ongoing. A few trees had to be removed, because of black knot in the limbs. Weed spraying to be done in the late part of August as recommended by Gene Chopiuk. Tennis court fences were repaired, court lines painted and weeds and grass growing through the court surface were sprayed. Outdoor Exercise equipment to be installed at R.V. Park yet this summer.

**POOL & SPRAY PARK:** Hot tubs were made operational. The pool has been sound mechanically and structurally this season with no major issues to report. The Spray Park had a slow start this season. With the **NEW** information regarding the ability to switch the park to Town water supply, indicating that it wasn't feasible at this time. The decision was made to start it as it was. A seized pump and a pump seal failure caused further delay of opening. Installation of a timer and activation button will happen this summer. This should help make this park more cost effective in the long run.

**CEMETERY:** Maintenance of new graves has been done. Routine mowing is ongoing. Several trees will be removed this summer, as they are dead and broken.

**COMPOST:** Compost loads are moderate. Four or five bags seem to be about average per stop. In the future, when considering a bag limit, this might be a good number to look at for a limit.

**ROADS:** Pot hole repairs are ongoing. Curb & crosswalks have been painted. Some sign replacement is required and should be complete by summer's end. Road patching should be done by the end of July. Alleys are being graded as time permits.

**SIDEWALKS:** Olds Concrete has completed their work and have left town.

**WATER & WASTEWATER:** We have experienced three water leaks in the last two months two were on the same street, a day apart. The cause for these two leaks was old rusted & rotten materials that just failed. Reservoir #2 has had a flow meter failure and needs replacing. It has left us filling the tank manually with having to check it every hour or so when filling. We are pumping the North Lagoon underdrain with a diesel powered pump. The two electric motors that are normally there have failed. We have been unsuccessful at finding someone to fix them so far.



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

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CPO Report July 2014 from Kyle Koller

Through the months of May – July many tickets and warnings were given; most tickets were given for speeding. In Rimbey alone there were 36 speeding tickets issued in May, 37 in June and, as of July 24, there were 23 speeding tickets issued.

In Gull Lake nine speeding tickets were issued in June and 23 in July with approximately 38 warnings.

In Parkland Beach there were three speeding tickets issued in May and four in June with approximately 40 warnings.

In Sunbreaker Cove there were two speeding tickets issued in June and two in July with approximately 40 warnings.

In Norglenwold there was one speeding ticket issued in May, two speeding tickets in June and as of July 24 there have been two speeding with approximately 30 warnings.

In Jarvis Bay there was 1 ticket issued in May for failing to stop at a stop sign, 1 in June for failing to stop at a stop sign and as of July 24 there were 2 tickets given out for failure to stop at a stop sign with approximately 28 educated warnings.

In Birchcliff there were 2 speeding tickets issued for the month of June with approximately 27 warnings.

Along with the several speeding tickets issued in Rimbey and The Summer Villages there were also many tickets for illegal parking and seatbelt violations.

Peace Officers have noticed the speed reduction by citizens at 51 Street and 57 Avenue Playground Zone has dropped from 98% to about 91% non-compliance.

There have been some complaints on 50 Avenue on both the west side and the east side of Rimbey. Traffic enforcement has been conducting some education and enforcement in those areas and various times of the day. Early morning speeds between 4:30 am to 8:00 am have been 65 km/hr to 100 km/hr the posted 50 km/hr zone. The average speed has been 78km/hr and Sgt. Koller has been strict with high rates of speed.

Peace Officers have been dealing with various bylaw complaints such as unattached trailers, grass and weeds; also some overhanging trees on property affecting or obstructing the back alleys. So far we've experienced 100% compliance when we've contacted residents.

The new Laser Dragoneye and Stalker Radar Units have been ordered, received and installed.

Public works has created a Horizontal and Vertical Distance sign for the testing of the lazer equipment. Located in the staff parking area. Thank you very much to Bruce at Public Works and the employees at Parkland Automotive for creating the sign for the Peace Officers.

A Council and public meeting was attended at Gull Lake on July 12, 2014. Peace Officer Klause and myself presented a safety, Bylaw and Traffic education presentation. It was very successful and compliments were received from the Mayor and CAO for our attendance.

CPO Jay Klause, Mayor Rick Pankiw and myself attended the Parkland Beach Council Meeting. Questions were answered and a presentation on traffic and bylaw education was given and seemed to be a very positive response from the Council and public to our presence.

Dear Chief Elected Official:

I would like to provide you, and your councils, with a status update on Alberta's progress with the Government of Canada on the New Building Canada Fund (NBCF).

Claims made by Opposition parties that Alberta is delaying signing the agreements are patently false. Since the announcement, we have been hard at work understanding what each of the fund's components will look like here in Alberta and finalizing these agreements. To the best of my knowledge, no province has completed agreements for all components of the NBCF, although negotiations are ongoing.

The Government of Canada announced the NBCF on March 27, 2014. At that time, little detail on the fund, or how it would be administered, was provided to the provinces. In addition, each province was required to negotiate individual agreements with the federal government on each component of the fund. These are new agreements that differ from the former agreements, so we needed to take time to review them to ensure that Alberta's interests, and those of our municipalities, were well served.

Alberta's priorities are to finalize the new Gas Tax Fund (GTF) Agreement and determine projects that could be submitted under the National Infrastructure Component (NIC), since funding for this component is on a first-come, first-served basis. Alberta has several strategic priorities that could qualify under the NIC. We will continue to coordinate with our federal counterparts in order to receive the best outcomes for all Albertans and municipalities with the money allocated to this component. This has been seen most clearly in our mutual commitment to fund Edmonton's Valley Line LRT under Provincial-Territorial Infrastructure Component (PTIC).

I am pleased to inform you that the new GTF agreement was officially signed off by both Alberta and Canada in late June. The first installment of the Gas Tax Fund will occur on July 15, and will include roughly 50 percent, or \$104 million, of the total \$208 million Alberta is expected to receive this year.

Under the terms of the agreement, Alberta municipalities will be allocated more than \$1 billion for the first five years of the program. The funding for the second five years of the program will be determined based on the 2016 census data.

The renewed GTF provides long-term funding for municipalities to help build and revitalize local public infrastructure. Additional flexibility to address specific local infrastructure priorities is provided through a range of eligible projects, including recreational and cultural infrastructure, broadband connectivity, disaster mitigation infrastructure, and brownfield redevelopment.

Further information on program terms and conditions, as well as the application process, will be provided in the GTF program guidelines, which will be available shortly. The program information will also include municipal funding allocations. Similar to the process for the former GTF, each municipality will need to sign an agreement with the province to access this funding.

Under the Provincial-Territorial Infrastructure Component (PTIC), Alberta is expected to receive \$942 million over 10 years. This includes \$848 million over 10 years for the National and Regional Projects (NRP) fund, for medium and large scale projects, and \$94 million over 10 years for the Small Communities Fund (SCF), which provides funding to municipalities with populations under 100,000.

We have been working with the federal government to ensure NRP funding recognizes the significant infrastructure investments Alberta is already making and aligns the program with our \$19 billion Capital Plan to get best value for Albertans.

We are working expeditiously to review the draft SCF agreement provided by the federal government, and will work to protect the interests of municipalities while ensuring that appropriate program criteria are in place to meet local, regional, and provincial priorities. In order to give all Alberta municipalities equal opportunity to access this funding, we are planning to issue a one-time call for SCF applications in January 2015, which will allocate the entire \$94 million available to Alberta.

This will give all eligible municipalities time to prepare submissions and complete the application process. More information outlining Alberta's approach, including the application process and more detail on criteria and thresholds, will be provided in the coming months. Rest assured, that the timing of the application submission will not reduce the total funding allocated to Alberta under the SCF nor will it jeopardize access to these funds.

While I understand that some of the comments made recently by those not involved in negotiating and signing the various agreements may have caused you concern, know that the funding allocated to Alberta is not on a use-it or lose-it basis, and municipalities will receive the full benefit announced in the NBCF plan.

Through the Government of Alberta's \$19 billion Capital Plan, we are making strategic investments to support local infrastructure needs. We are pleased to have the federal government support these efforts through the NBCF.

I look forward to partnering with you and the Government of Canada to build strong and prosperous communities and will continue to advocate to the federal government on behalf of Albertans and Alberta municipalities.


I am pleased to announce that the new Alberta Community Partnership (ACP) guidelines and application form are now available on the Municipal Affairs website at [www.municipalaffairs.alberta.ca/albertacommunitypartnership.cfm](http://www.municipalaffairs.alberta.ca/albertacommunitypartnership.cfm). The guidelines and form are retroactive to April 1, 2014.

The ACP replaces the former Regional Collaboration Program (RCP). The new program retains feature elements of the former RCP, but with expanded project eligibility that includes support for capital and limited-term operating expenditures, and options for multi-year funding.

The ACP has grown from four to six program components. Two new components, Intermunicipal Collaboration (IC) and Metropolitan Funding (MF), have been created from the former Regional Collaboration component, and a new Viability Review Support (VRS) component has been added to provide support for municipal restructuring activities. The Mediation and Cooperative Processes, Municipal Internship, and Strategic Initiatives components are retained under the ACP, with the addition of a new finance officer stream under the Municipal Internship component.

The IC component provides support up to \$350,000 towards collaborations of two or more municipalities to explore, plan, or implement new or enhanced regional municipal services. Full details on the IC component can be found in Schedule 1 of the ACP guidelines.

The MF component provides an annual funding allocation to municipalities with populations greater than 55,000, to support the unique pressures faced by Alberta's largest municipalities. It also provides an annual allocation to the Capital Region Board and Calgary Regional Partnership for their operations.

Beginning in 2015/16, a municipal cost-share requirement will be introduced to both the IC and MF components. Cost-share requirements stipulate that a specific portion of the project or allocation must be funded by the participating municipalities undertaking the project.

Thank you for the May 30, 2014 email from Kathy Blakely, Executive Assistant, requesting a meeting regarding the New Building Canada Fund (NBCF).

The New Building Canada Plan was confirmed by the federal government in the federal Budget 2014, and includes 10 years of funding under various program components beginning in 2014/15. Under the Gas Tax Fund, Alberta will receive \$208.65 million in 2014/15, and \$1.08 billion in funding over the first five years of the program. Alberta is in the final stages of negotiating the agreement with the federal government. Once the federal-provincial agreement is signed, agreements will be signed between the province and each municipality.

Alberta is also expected to receive \$942 million over 10 years under the Provincial-Territorial Infrastructure Component of the NBCF. This includes \$94 million for the Small Communities Fund (SCF), which provides funding to municipalities with populations under 100,000. Alberta is currently working with the federal government to ensure that the agreement for the SCF recognizes the needs of Alberta's municipalities and is administratively fair, effective and efficient.

I understand the importance of these programs to your municipality. I would like to assure you that you will not lose access to any funding under either program due to the timing of the signing of the agreements for each program.



Municipalities will be provided with additional information on both programs as soon as this information is available.





# FAQs

## 1. What is 211?

211 is a free, confidential information and referral system for thousands of community and social services available across the province. Now, 211 is available in Central Alberta, Calgary, Edmonton, and the regional municipality of Wood Buffalo – 24 hours a day, 365 days a year – by searching the easy-to-use online database at [www.ab.211.ca](http://www.ab.211.ca).

## 2. Who can use 211?

211 is for people from all walks of life, seeking information about community and social services in their community or in the province, either for themselves or for someone else. For example, it could be used by a senior looking for a local senior's centre, a teenager looking for shelter, or someone fleeing family violence.

## 3. How does 211 work?

211 has collected thousands of records on community and social service programs delivered throughout the province by local community groups, non-profit agencies and government departments. The information at 211 is organized by "need" – not by who delivers the service – this makes it easier to search. Importantly, 211 is dedicated to working every day to expand the list of services and to ensure it is always accurate.

## 4. Why is 211 useful?

When a difficult situation is being faced for the first time, the path to overcoming it might not seem obvious. Finding a local food bank, or summer camp may be problematic. That's where 211 comes in. The team at 211 has solutions that are just a "click" away. Even problems that seem trivial, like coping with loneliness or adjusting to a new part of life in Central Alberta, 211 is there to help.

## 5. What are the benefits of the 211 service?

211 helps identify service gaps, duplication, and emerging trends to help policy decision makers direct the right resources and services to where they are needed most. 211 helps people reach the programs and services they need in many areas of the province

## 6. How will 211 help the people of Central Alberta use our current resources more cost effectively?

There are hundreds of not for profit organizations in Central Alberta, in addition to scores of government agencies. When individuals go without help because they are unaware of the services available to them, our communities waste valuable resources and people fail to get the support they need. With 211, communities can address the diverse needs of their residents and ensure increased coordination among services, identify gaps and overlaps in services by geographic mapping, and track human service usage. By providing a centralized point of information, 211 will help ensure the most efficient use of community resources.

## **7. Will other service providers see benefits from 211 as well?**

One of the significant value-added elements of 211 is its online database that provides easy-to-use and easy-to-search information on every social service and program in the province. With this new and very powerful tool at their fingertips, Central Alberta's many service providers will be able to quickly direct people to services outside of their organization's scope or area of expertise. It will also allow them to discover and connect with other service providers whose goals and mandates complement their own, building stronger community networks.

## **8. Can't people just look in the phone book for services?**

Telephone books are helpful but don't tell the full story. Many organizations provide multiple services and providers are not listed by each service, nor are the services always reflected in the organizations name. 211 maintains an extensive database of services that include information on how to access the service.

## **9. Why a regional service?**

211 service will ensure that all people, regardless of where they live, will have equal access to information. For example, this would allow a resident in Stettler to easily identify home support options for their father living in Sylvan Lake, or assist an immigrant in finding services once they move to Red Deer. Both costs and benefits are optimized with a regional approach. Furthermore, the overall goal is to eventually have 211 services across Canada. By having a regional service, it is much easier to plug into a national network, providing rapid and effective service for all Canadians.

## **10. Who is paying for this?**

The United Way of Central Alberta is funding the database for 211 Central Alberta for the foreseeable future. Funding for the phone part of the system will need to be secured before the phone system can be set up.

## **11. Has this been done before?**

With the launch of the 211 service in Central Alberta over 60% of Canadians will have access to 211 information. 211 centers are located in Saskatchewan, Ontario, British Columbia, Edmonton, Calgary and Quebec City. In the United States, 211 serves over 80% of the population in 48 states.

## **12. Has any research been done regarding the value of 211?**

Comprehensive research on the costs and benefits of 211 systems have been conducted in both the US and Canada. United Ways in Saskatchewan, Manitoba, British Columbia and Ontario have worked with a number of organizations including Deloitte, to develop specific business cases and identify the potential of a 211 service. These studies including one done in Saskatchewan confirm the strength of the 211 business cases and the inherent value of the service. Each of the studies concluded that the measurable benefits of a national system outweigh the costs by a significant margin. Everyone – public, governments and service providers – stand to realize substantial benefits from the time and cost savings that 211 can provide.

## **13. How does 211 deal with privacy concerns?**

All contact with 211 whether by email or online query is confidential. No names or other personal information is collected.

#### **14. How will 211 help those in communities with few services?**

Given the rural nature of areas of Central Alberta, locating services so that they are accessible to everyone is often a challenge. If 211 does not have information within a citizen's community, 211 will help find those services closest to where they live. Also, 211 collects important information on needs that are not being met either because services are not available or because demands are greater than can be met by existing service. 211 provides vital information to planners who are then able to use it to better understand where the needs are and how service delivery can be improved to meet those needs.





Dear Mayor and Councillors,

In 2004, the House of Commons came together in historic fashion to unanimously pass the Westray Act. The legislation came in response to the horrific Westray coalmine explosion in Nova Scotia that killed 26 miners on May 9, 1992, and after a strong lobby campaign by the United Steelworkers to demand "No More Westrays".

The legislation was intended to hold corporate executives, directors and managers criminally responsible for workplace deaths. Ten years later, approximately 10,000 Canadians have been killed on the job, yet not one corporate executive has faced a single day in jail.

In response to this shameful record, our union has launched a campaign to "Stop The Killing and Enforce The Law", which asks provincial, territorial and federal governments to work together to ensure that workplace deaths are taken seriously and that, where warranted, the Westray Law is enforced.

As part of this campaign, we are asking City Councils to pass resolutions expressing their support for proactive action to protect workers. Though not an area of municipal responsibility, we recognize you as community leaders and this is a community issue. There is no place in Canada that has not been touched by workplace deaths, and your voices are needed to encourage senior levels of government to take steps to enforce the Westray Law.

Already communities across Canada have endorsed the enclosed resolution, including Toronto, Sudbury, St. Sault Marie, Hamilton in Ontario, Nanaimo, Burnaby, Lake Cowichan, New Westminster, Port Alberni, Mission in British Columbia, and Flin Flon in Manitoba.

I respectfully request that your council consider adding its voice by passing this resolution, and sending it to your provincial municipal association. In doing so, you will be sending a message to senior levels of government that it is time to work together to Stop the Killing, and Enforce the Law.

## SAMPLE RESOLUTION

Enforce the Westray Amendments to Canada's Criminal Code

WHEREAS it has been more than two decades since the Westray mine disaster in Nova Scotia and a decade since amendments were made to the Criminal Code of Canada to hold corporations, their directors and executives criminally accountable for the health and safety of workers; and

WHEREAS police and prosecutors are not utilizing the Westray amendments, and not investigating workplace fatalities through the lens of criminal accountability; and

WHEREAS more than 1,000 workers a year are killed at work

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this Council support a campaign to urge our federal/provincial/territorial government to ensure that:

- Crown attorneys are educated, trained and directed to apply the Westray amendments;

- Dedicated prosecutors are given the responsibility for health and safety fatalities;

- Police are educated, trained and directed to apply the Westray amendments;

- There is greater coordination among regulators, police and Crown attorneys so that health and safety regulators are trained to reach out to police when there is a possibility that Westray amendment charges are warranted.
