

### RIMBEY UNITED CHURCH COLLECTING WINTER ITEMS

Again this winter Rimbey United Church is coordinating the collection of winter articles for Turning Point.

Turning Point Society in Red Deer has been responding to the needs of communities using a harm reduction approach for 30 years.

Turning point runs 6 different programs. One of these is called "NightReach".

365 evenings a year, a team of two NightReach staff walk the streets and paths offering after-hour support to a wide range of individuals facing vulnerability due to place or circumstance. NightReach staff are easily recognizable by their bright red backpacks, which are packed with a wide range of harm reduction materials, clothing, first aid supplies and snacks NightReach also provides non-judgmental support and referrals for food, housing, health care, addictions, pregnancy support, legal concerns and employment services to many streetinvolved individuals. Staff also do debris clean-up as required.

This is the fifth year Rimbey United Church plans to support this program by collecting winter clothing for adult men and women. Gently used winter boots and clothing may be dropped off at the church or Rimbey Public Library. Gloves, hand warmers and new toothbrushes are also needed. The church will accept any monetary donations for this program and forward them to Turning Point. Collection date Oct 15th to Jan 15th.
